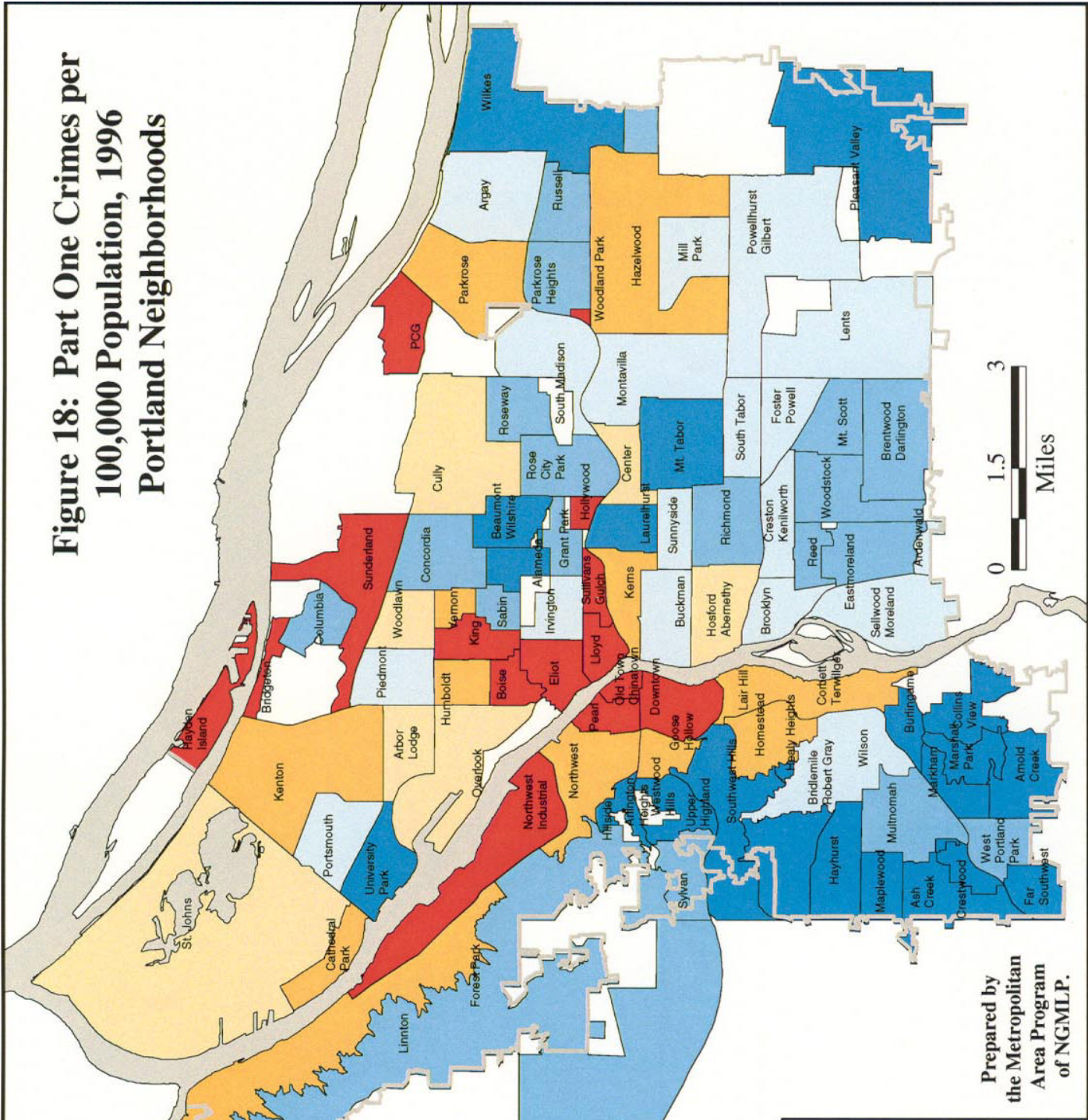


**Figure 18: Part One Crimes per 100,000 Population, 1996

Figure 19: Population Density by Neighborhood, 1993

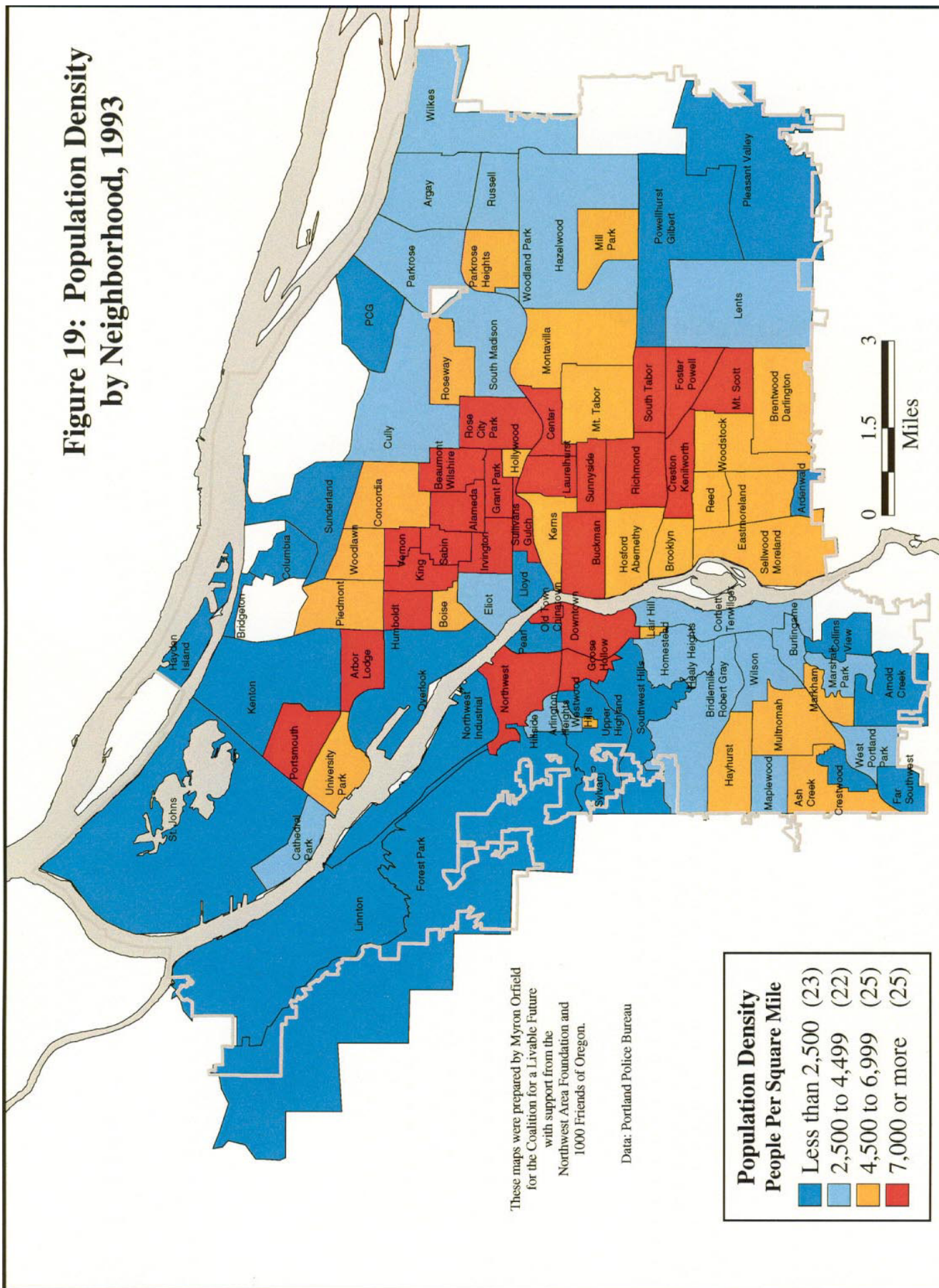


Figure 20: Percentage Change in the Number of Jobs Per Capita by County Subarea, 1980-1994

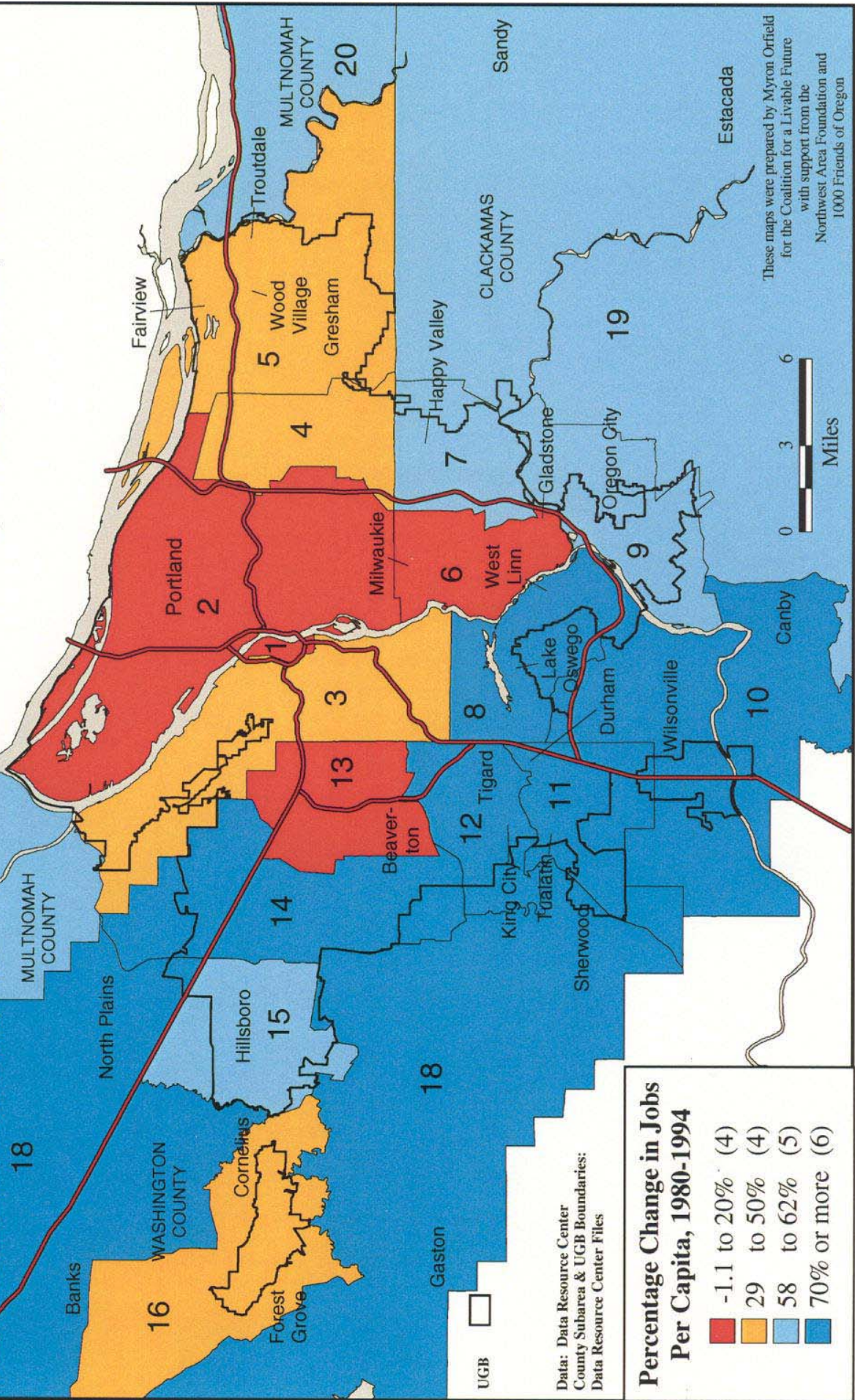
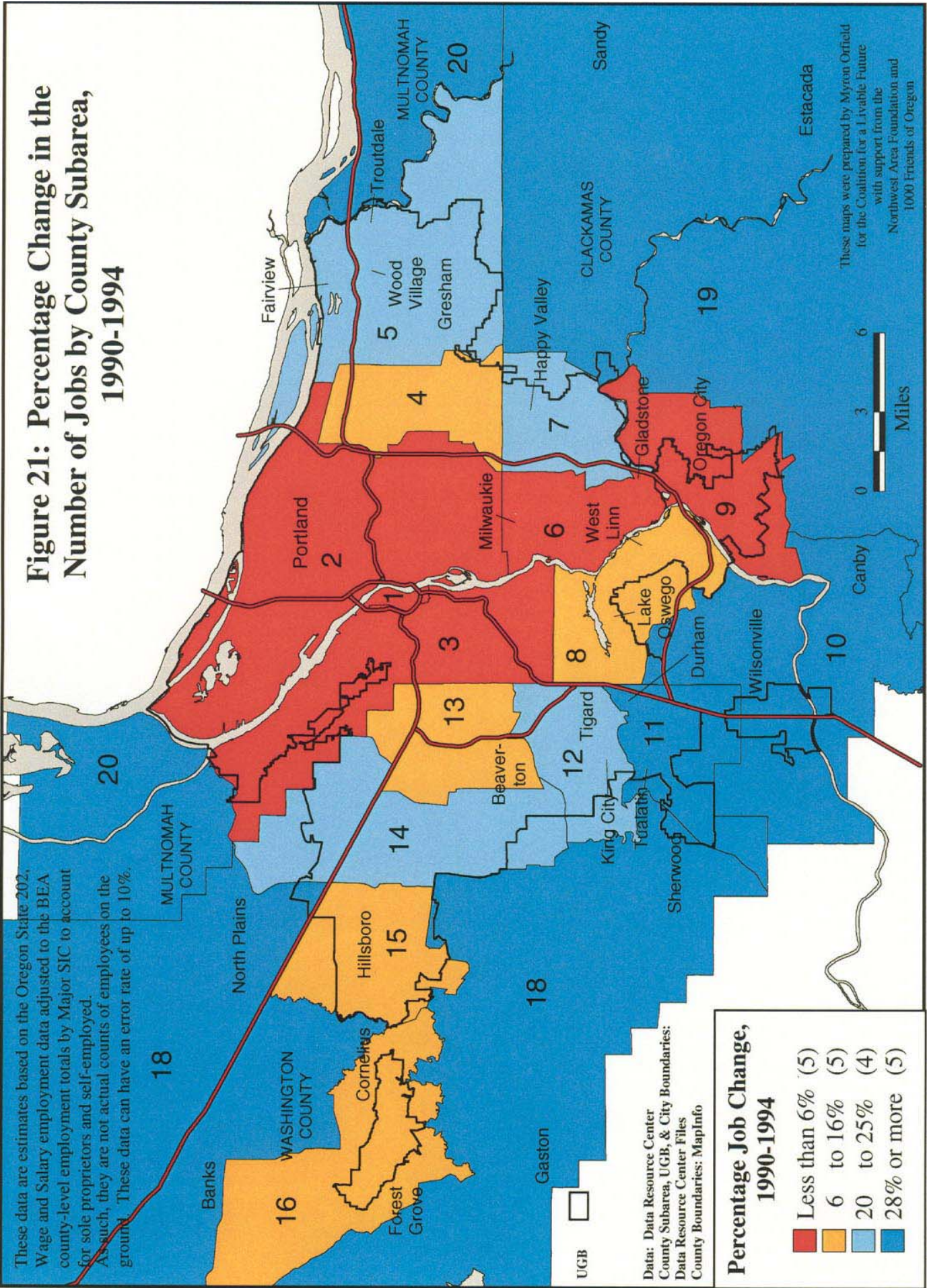


Figure 21: Percentage Change in the Number of Jobs by County Subarea, 1990-1994
